I am so sorry that it has taken me so long to get a letter out to you. I want to thank you for running such a wonderful foundation - the only one that I know of that grants wishes to those with terminally ill breast cancer. And I would also like to thank you for granting a wish for my mother, Eva Kettlewell for a Disneyworld trip for her, my dad and my 15 year old brother.

We all had a great time at Disney, however, we only made it 2 days there before we had to take my mom to the hospital. She had pneumonia and other complications. It came on very suddenly. The doctors tried their best to get her well enough to make it back home, but they could not get her oxygen levels to remain stable. She died 2 days later on November 23rd after a courageous 16 month battle with very aggressive cancer. She was 41 years old. She will be greatly missed.

It really means a lot to our family that this trip was granted for her and though we had hoped for a better outcome, there is comfort in knowing that she spent her last days with her family in Florida on a trip she was so excited about.

She had wanted to personally thank everyone who made this trip possible.

So, on behalf of my mom, Eva, I would like to thank you Anna and Fran and to everyone who has contributed to the Making Memories Breast Cancer Foundation for getting this trip together so quickly for her. You gave her so much to look forward to. You guys are wonderful and truly make a difference for families going through this terrible disease.
